Dear Delaware Prescriber:

I am writing to notify you about important new regulations for the safe prescribing of opiates. **The new regulations will take effect April 1, 2017.**

The United States consumes the vast majority of opiates across the world. According to the Centers for Disease Control, Delaware's prescription rate for certain categories of opiates is among the highest in the nation. The decision to publish new regulations on the use of opiates for acute and chronic pain was reached only after extensive discussion and consideration. These regulations recognize the fact, as reported by many heroin users, that dependence on and abuse of opiates are traceable to an acute procedure or injury for which opiates were prescribed. Evolving recognition that opiates should perhaps not be the first treatment of choice, combined with our state's growing rate of unintended overdoses, weighed heavily on this decision.

New regulations for the safe prescribing of opiates were published in the January 1, 2017 issue of the Delaware Register of Regulations and will take effect April 1, 2017. The new regulations are the end result of a formal rule-making process conducted over the past 18 months. During this process, we considered input and testimony from many stakeholder groups regarding the evolving best practices in this arena.

Although they won't solve Delaware's prescription drug problems on their own, the new regulations are needed. They:

- establish basic standards for prescribing opiates safely
- give new requirements on prescribing opiates for acute episodes as well as for chronic, long term pain management
